

MINUTES
THORNBURY TOWNSHIP (CHESTER COUNTY)
HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION MEETING
Wednesday, November 10, 2010

Present: Anne Dzamba, Chris Lang (chair), Molly Morrison, Tom Spackman, Kris Walker, Dick Webster.

1. Approval of Minutes
The commission approved the minutes of October 13, 2010, as amended to include Westtown Station as a historical building to be submitted to *The Gander*.
2. Oral History Project
Chris Lang interviewed Tom Spackman, our first and trial oral history, on video at the West Chester Senior Center today with the help of Jim Mobile, who will edit the video and put it on DVD. We will review its DVD to refine our process.
3. 2011 Budget
Discussion of the Commission's expected expenses for conducting its oral history interviews led to two motions.
Motion (Morrison/Dzamba): Request from the Board of Supervisors a 2011 HPC budget of \$3000. **Action:** Approved.
Motion (Spackman/Walker): Pay the West Chester Senior Center a retainer of \$1000 for coordinating interviews and video editing of the Township's Oral History Project.
Action: Approved.
4. Articles for *The Gander*
Tom Spackman has his article on his buildings ready for the next issue of *The Gander*, due Dec 3. Anne Dzamba will review it before submittal. Also Anne will write about the Westtown Station next. In 2011 Kris Walker and Dick Webster will write about Green Shadows and Lenape respectively. The Commission will submit an article about the Oral History Project for the March 2011 issue.
5. Barn Survey
Tom Spackman and Dick Webster will conduct a barn survey of the Township. Chris Lang toured and photographed Spackman's barn on the 1709 Farm.
6. Squire Cheyney Farm
The Commission may meet with the Board of Supervisors to discuss the farm. Chris Lang will invite Ric Miller and John McIlhenny from Thornbury Township, Delaware County, to the next commission meeting to hear their ideas about the farm.
7. Commission Records
The Township has ordered a fireproof file cabinet for Commission records.
