

**THORNBURY TOWNSHIP, CHESTER COUNTY
BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
WORK SESSION**

MINUTES – March 5, 2019

The Thornbury Township Board of Supervisors' Work Session was called to order at 6:15 p.m. in the Thornbury Township meeting room. In attendance were Supervisors Jim Benoit Chairman; Bob Anthony, Vice-Chairman; Joe Lisa, Bill Reilly and Michael Gallagher. Also, in attendance were Judy Lizza, Township Manager; Teresa DeStefano, Township Secretary and Kathy Labrum Township Solicitor.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

1. Eagle Scout Project presentation David Thomson

David Thomson gave a brief presentation of the Blue Bird nesting boxes he will be building for the Squire Cheyney Park. He handed out drawings and outlined the cost of the project. The project will be completed late April early May. The cost of the material will be around \$200.00.

Jim Benoit moved to approve the cost of the material for the Eagle Scout Project. Seconded by Joe Lisa. All were in favor. Motion carried.

2. Resolution 2019-12 Chester County Grant Resolution

Judy Lizza mentioned that she has applied for Chester County Grant for open space. The Resolution will be on the agenda for approval at the next Board meeting

3. Resolution 2019-13 PA DCNR Grant Resolution

Judy Lizza mentioned that she will apply for the DCNR C2P2 Grant for open space. The Resolution will be on the agenda for approval at the next Board meeting

4. Septic System Pump Requirement (OLDS) Expired permits: action for remaining violators

Judy Lizza updated the Board on that there are six residents that have not complied. Final notice has been sent. Next correspondence will direct fines and court fees. Judy Lizza will draft the letter; Kathy will review.

5. Neff Construction Contract renewal

Judy Lizza noted that the contract for Neff Construction has an extension and can be approved at the next board meeting

6. Liquid Fuel money received \$121,449.38

Judy Lizza stated that the Township has received the Liquid Fuel money and it is an increase over last year.

7. **New trash receptacles for Goose Creek Park**

Judy Lizza mention that the new trash receptacles have been delivered and noted that the invoice will be on this month's bill list.

OTHER MATTERS:


Judy Lizza presented the Brandywine Battlefield Connectivity Plan; the goal is to have a multi municipal interpretive plan. There are seven Townships invited to participate. Further discussion at the next Board of Supervisor meeting.
