

**THORNBURY TOWNSHIP, CHESTER COUNTY
BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
REGULAR MEETING
MINUTES August 20, 2019**

CALL TO ORDER:

The regularly scheduled meeting of the Thornbury Township Board of Supervisors was called to order by Jim Benoit - Chairman at 6:15 PM in the Thornbury Township meeting room. In attendance were Supervisors Joe Lisa and Mike Gallagher. Judy Lizza, Township Manager, Teresa DeStefano, Township Secretary and Kathy Labrum, Township Solicitor, were also in attendance. The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted by Jim Benoit.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Jim Benoit motioned to approve the July 16, 2019 Board of Supervisors Minutes and the August 6, 2019 Work Session Minutes. The motion was seconded by Joe Lisa. All were in favor. Motion carried.

MANAGER'S REPORT:

Judy Lizza presented the Manager's report.

Judy reported road repairs have begun on S. New St. additional work on S. Concord road will begin on Thursday.

Judy noted that Mike Conrad in a letter dated August 16, 2019 has recommended the approval of payment for the 2019 Road Program in the amount of \$227,085.84.

Jim Benoit made a motion to approve payment in the amount of \$227,085.84 to INNCON for the 2019 Paving Project. The motion was second by Mike Gallagher. All were in favor. Motion carried.

The Park and Recreation Commission will be hosting Thornbury Day on October 19, 2019 11:30 AM to 3 PM.

Scott Nelson, Constituent Advocate for Representative Chrissy Houlahan, 6th District, Pennsylvania introduced himself and the services of the office to the Township for Federal issues.


UNFINISHED BUSINESS:
